## 6. Ultimate Canada Conference

- If you build it (fields) - 3 different approaches, Ottawa, Quebec City, Winnipeg,
  - Winnipeg - leasing land from rugby, 7 grass fields to start added 4 more, issues with grass quality, in charge of their own maintenance. Lease portable washrooms for summers. Looked at adding a club house, pros storage, profits, cons: tax, vandalism, ect. Have applied for Municipal, Provincial, Federal grants, sponsorships, naming rights. Can control maintenance, can't lose fields for events. Quality and Quantity. Help legitimize fields. Overall better. Adding 4 fields, costs \$230 000 to sod fields.
  - Ottawa - City couldn't offer enough land, bought 109 acres, developed 29 acres. Now have 18-19 fields. Sold shares. Bought land to get started, then got started with rest of development. Formed partnership with agriculture college for grass research which made it cheaper. Irrigated, draws from huge pond. Seeded instead of sod. 60 000 to seed 5 fields. Level, no loans. At this point still have 25 shares outstanding, so can't put "organization" back within league. So separate legal entity. Costs 100 00 in maintenace a year for 19 fields. Contingency fund for pump. zoned as rural so taxes are low. Private property so city has no control.
  - Quebec City - leases from Hydro Quebec under towers for \$1, and then they

paid for fields to be built. 20 minutes from downtown. Cost \$60 000, built 2 fields at first. In 2005 added 2 more fields, 2006, 1 more, 2007 1 more, and 2010 added 3 more. 4 fields to sod \$125 000
